Comparing the above record with that submitted by your nurse last year, there may at first glance appear to be a falling off in the amount of work done by the nurse during 1929. However that can readily be explained. Owing to a new system of keeping the records, which was this past year put into operation, we have been recording only the actual number of visits made at individual homes rather than counting all the persons to whom service may have been rendered in each home during any one visit. As a matter of fact, the bedside work was far heavier in 1929 than for some years previous.

The feature of our work, which we have been attempting to stress more than any one other during 1929, is educating the parents of the pre-school child to train the child in the forming of good health habits—correct diet, sufficient rest, outdoor exercise and bodily cleanliness.

It is the aim of our service to have the townspeople recognize the community nurse as their friend, assured of her interest and helpful cooperation in all their problems.

REPORT OF FIRE DEPARTMENT

Organized March 14, 1928

Respectfully submit the following report of the Westport Fire Department.

The personnel consists of a Chief, First Assistant Engineer, a Second Assistant Engineer, a Deputy Chief, one Captain, one Lieutenant and twenty men, all serving gratis.

From January 1, to December 31, 1929 the Fire Department answered 49 alarms classified as follows:

Westport's apparatus responded to two calls from the Town of Little Compton for which the Town of Westport was paid \$200.00.

During the year one more piece of apparatus has been added to the Department, which is a Chevrolet chassis with three water tanks with a capacity of 95 gallons each, a total of 285 gallons. This piece has proved its worth several times and we find it invaluable where we have no other water supply. I respectfully recommend that the appropriation for 1930 be enough to enable us to install a small cheap pump on this piece to facilitate a quick refill.

It is respectfully recommended that in sending in a call for the Fire Department, especially from North Westport and Acoaxet, the person sending the call be sure to say **WESTPORT** FIRE DEPARTMENT, EMERGENCY. The operator will then connect them with the Westport operator who will take the call herself or will connect directly with the proper phone.

It should be remembered that the above named sections of the Town are on the Fall River and Little Compton telephone exchanges respectively. Therefore unless the call is properly given trouble may be experienced in getting prompt action. Please remember no number is necessary. Just say Westport Fire Department, Emergency, and give the name of road and also the name of the place if possible or some place nearby.

It is also suggested that in case of fire that a call be sent for the Fire Department FIRST, then do what you can toward putting it out, but don't take chances. The Department would much rather make a run and find the fire out on arrival than to find the owner or occupant had waited too long, thinking he could put it out himself and too late find he was fighting a losing fight.

The library hours are from 3 to 5 and from 7 to 9 $\rm P.\,M.$ every Saturday.

The circulation from the main library was 3041 for the year. Many books have been loaned to and circulated from schools but the circulation figures have not been kept.

The children's room has been finished and furnished and the children are making good use of it. An effort has been made to buy many books that are interesting, attractive and useful for children and young people, for a large proportion of those who use the library are school boys and girls.

There has been some demand for books on special subjects which may be borrowed from the State Division of Public Libraries. Anyone wishing to make use of this service should consult Mrs. Howland at the library.

I submit herewith my report of an audit of the accounts of the town of Westport for the period from June 11, 1928, to November 6, 1929, and the installation of a system of accounts as petitioned for by vote of the town and in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 44 of the General Laws. This report is in the form of a report made to me by Mr. Edward H. Fenton, Chief Accountant of this Division.

Sir:

As directed by you, I have made an audit of the books and accounts of the town of Westport for the period from June 11, 1928, the date of the previous audit, to November

6, 1929 and, in addition, have installed a system of accounts as petitioned for by a vote of the town and in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 44 of the General Laws, the following report being submitted thereon:—

The financial transactions of the town, as recorded on the books of the several departments receiving or disbursing money for the town, were examined and reconciled with the books and records of the auditor and of the town accountant.

The books and accounts of the auditor and of the town accountant were examined and checked in detail. The recorded receipts were compared with the treasurer's books, and the recorded disbursements were checked with the warrants authorized by the selectmen and with the record of payments in the treasurer's office.

The ledger accounts were analyzed and all appropriations and transfers were checked with the town clerk's records of the town meetings.

In checking the appropriations it was noted that appropriations are made for "General Government," against which are charged all bills of the several general departments, and that an appropriation is made for "Protection of Persons and Property," which is intended for several departments. It is recommended that, in the future, separate appropriations be voted for each of the main activities and functions of the town.

The ledger and classification book under the new system were written up for the period from January 1 to November 6, 1929, a trial balance was taken off, proving the ledger to be in balance, and a balance sheet, which is appended to this report, was prepared showing the financial condition of the town as of November 6, 1929.

The accounts of the town treasurer were examined and checked in detail. The cash book was footed, the recorded

receipts were analyzed, and the cash balance was verified by a reconciliation of the statements furnished by the banks of deposit and by an examination of the pass book issued by the savings bank.

Appended to this report is a table showing a reconciliation of the treasurer's cash.

The savings bank books and securities, representing the investments of the several trust funds in the custody of the treasurer, were examined and listed, the income was checked, and the withdrawals were compared with the records of the town treasurer.

The books and accounts of the Town Landing Commission were examined and checked in detail. The charges for leases were checked, the cash book was footed, and the cash balance was reconciled with the pass book of the savings bank.

The books and accounts of the several tax collectors for the levies of 1926, 1927, 1928, and 1929 were examined and checked in detail, and the cash on hand, representing balances in the hands of F. R. Slocum and E. D. Hammond, Tax Collectors, was reconciled with statements furnished by the several banks of deposit.

The recommitments of the several levies were verified, the commitments of poll and property taxes for the levies of 1928 and 1929, and of motor vehicle excise taxes of 1929, were analyzed; the payments to the treasurer were compared with the records in the treasurer's office; the abatements were checked with the assessors' records of abatements granted; and the outstanding accounts listed and proved. A further verification of the outstanding accounts was made by mailing notices to a number of persons whose names appeared on the books as owing money to the town, the replies received thereto indicating that the outstanding accounts, as listed, are correct.

The records of the town clerk for dog and for hunting and fishing licenses were examined and checked, the payments to the county and the State, respectively, being compared with the receipts on file, and the cash on hand being verified by an actual count.

It is recommended that the selectmen keep a detailed record of all licenses granted, so that the receipts therefrom may be properly checked.

The accounts and records of the sealer of weights and measures were examined and checked, and the payments to the treasurer were compared with the treasurer's records.

The surety bonds of the treasurer and the tax collector for the year 1929 for the faithful performance of their duties were examined and found to be in proper form.

In addition to the balance sheet there are appended to this report tables showing summaries of the tax accounts, town landing accounts, departmental receipts, and the transactions of the trust funds.

The books and accounts under the new system were opened as of January 1, 1929, and the financial transactions to November 6, 1929 were entered therein.

For the courtesies extended by the various officials during the progress of the audit and the installation of the system, I wish, on behalf of my assistant and for myself, to express appreciation.
