The number of cases aided by this department this year has been doubled. This necessitates twice the amount of the usual work of the Board in investigating. While the expenditures of the department have been considerably increased, by careful investigation and the cooperation of those aided, the expenses of the department have not been doubled, but all necessary aid has been given. Unless there is a marked improvement in the industrial situation it is probable that as much, or more, aid will be required this year.

The Board of Public Welfare considers itself the agent of the Town, and its tax-payers, and that it has a duty to

the tax-payer as well as to those who apply for aid. A careful investigation is made of each case and aid is given according to the facts found. To give more than is necessary would be unfair to the tax-payer, and to give less would be unfair to those aided.

An increased expenditure through this board will be necessary this year because of the Old Age Pension Law which goes into effect July 1, 1931.

The Board desires to again call attention to the rule of the Board, that all applications for assistance must be made by the persons desiring aid, and applications cannot be received from others.

The Board wishes to acknowledge the valuable aid given by the Police Department and the nurses. We also wish to thank the various organizations, store-keepers and individuals who have so generously donated food and clothing for the needy.

Report of the Trustees of the Free Public Library

The trustees of the Westport Free Public Library respectfully submit the following report for the year ending December 31, 1930:

The Board was organized as follows:

Chairman, Nason R. Macomber. Secretary, Ada S. Macomber. Librarian, Mrs. Annie R. Howland. Assistant Librarian, Mrs. George H. Howland.

The library hours are from 3 to 5 and from 7 to 9 P. M., every Saturday. On many Saturdays at five o'clock Mrs. Annie Howland has conducted a children's story hour which has been much appreciated by the children.

The circulation from the main library was 2,986, and some books have been loaned to schools for which circulation figures have not been kept.

The children's room has been used increasingly and new equipment has been added for the greater comfort of the girls and boys. Much interest has been manifested by them in the globe and atlas which were added this year. There has been a consistent effort to buy for the children's room only such books as are attractive and useful to the young people. We have added many non-fiction books, some on aviation and radio in response to requests for this kind of reading.

Some educational books have been supplied by the State Division of Public Libraries, which is always ready to assist libraries in small towns. For this service, consult Mrs. Howland at the Library.

The reduction in the price of non-fiction made it possible for us to add many interesting and informational books to the library, and there has been some success in circulating these books, particularly on special subjects suggested in the schools. We have endeavored to buy the books requested when we have found it advisable, and such requests are welcomed by the trustees that the library may cater to the taste of its patrons.

I submit herewith my report of an audit of the accounts of the town of Westport for the year ending December 31, 1930, made in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 44 of the General Laws. Sir:

As directed by you, I have made an audit of the books and accounts of the town of Westport for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1930 and submit the following report thereon:

The financial transactions of the town, as recorded on the books of the several departments receiving or disbursing money for the town, were examined and checked with the books and records of the town accountant. The books and accounts of the town accountant were examined and checked, the reported receipts being compared with the financial records of the several departments collecting money for the town and with the treasurer's books. The payments, as recorded on the ledger of the town accountant, were checked to the warrants authorizing disbursements and with the treasurer's cash book.

An analysis of the ledger was made for the audit period and a balance sheet showing the financial condition of the town as of December 31, 1930, was prepared and is appended to this report.

The ledger appropriation accounts were examined and checked with the appropriations, transfers and loans voted by the town as shown by the town clerk's record of financial votes.

The payments of debt and interest were checked with the amounts falling due and were found to be correct.

The books and accounts of the town treasurer were examined and checked. The footings of the cash book were proved, the reported receipts were analyzed and checked with the records of the departments making payments to the treasurer, while the payments were compared with the selectmen's warrants. The cash balance on January 8, 1931 was verified by a reconciliation of the statements furnished by the banks of deposit, by an examination of the savings bank book, and by an actual count of the cash in the office.

Appended to this report is a table showing a reconciliation of the treasurer's cash.

The savings bank books, representing the investments of the several trust funds in the custody of the town treasurer, were examined and listed. The income was checked and the withdrawals were compared with the records of the treasurer.

The books and accounts of the Town Landing Commission were examined and checked in detail. The cash book was footed and the cash balance was reconciled with the savings bank book.

The books and accounts of the tax collectors were examined and checked in detail. The cash on hand representing balances in the hands of E. D. Hammond and F. R. Slocum, Tax Collectors, was reconciled with statements furnished by the banks of deposit. The commitment of the 1930 poll and property levy, together with the several commitments of the 1930 motor vehicle excise taxes, was proved, the abatements were checked with the assessors' record of abatements granted, the payments to the treasurer were compared with the treasurer's cash book, and the outstanding taxes were listed and verified with the accountant's ledger accounts.

The outstanding taxes were further verified by mailing notices to a number of persons whose names appeared on the books as owing money to the town, the replies received thereto indicating that the accounts, as listed, are correct.

Tables showing a summary of the tax levies, together with a reconciliation of the collector's cash accounts, are appended to this report.

The tax title deeds on hand were examined. The tax titles taken by the town during the audit period were checked with the tax accounts and the redemptions were compared with the treasurer's cash book. All tax titles were listed and a summary table showing the condition of the tax title account is attached to this report.

The financial records of the town clerk were examined in detail. The recorded receipts on account of sporting, dog, and local licenses were checked with the stubs of licenses issued. The payments to the State and the county were verified with the receipts on file, and the payments to the town treasurer were checked with the treasurer's cash book. The cash on hand was verified by an actual count.

Licenses issued by the selectmen were listed, and payments to the treasurer were compared with the treasurer's cash book. It is recommended that the selectmen keep a detailed record of all licenses granted so that the receipts therefrom may be properly checked.

The records of the sealer of weights and measures were examined and checked, and the payments to the treasurer were verified by a comparison with the treasurer's cash book.

The surety bonds of the several town officers required by law to furnish a bond were examined and found to be in proper form.

For the co-operation and courtesies extended by the various town officials during the audit, I wish, on behalf of my assistants, and for myself, to express appreciation.
