

Charles R. Wood was designated as inspector of garbage collection and equipment.

Dr. E. W. Burt was appointed supervisor of the dental clinic and nursing service.

Edward L. Macomber was appointed Agent of the Board to receive reports of contagious diseases.

Mrs. Sybil L. Mercer was re-engaged as Community Nurse, and Miss Elizabeth A. Davis and Mrs. Grace DeAndrade as substitute nurses.

For Inspectors of Slaughtering, John C. Partington, John L. Duffany, and Edward S. Francis were re-appointed.

The following named persons were licensed as Funeral Directors:

Kenneth A. Potter and Henry W. Brightman.

Twenty-six burial permits, 34 milk licenses, ten (10) alcohol licenses, 14 licenses for transportation of garbage were issued during the year.

On March 1, 1945 Mrs. Mercer, Community Nurse, applied for a six months' leave of absence to serve as a civilian nurse with the U. S. Army.

Before this leave had expired, Mrs. Mercer sustained a serious illness and died. Mrs. Mercer had served this Town faithfully for many years and her passing will be mourned by those who remember her unselfish devotion to her duties.

Mrs. Grace DeAndrade who was appointed a substitute for the duration of Mrs. Mercer's leave was appointed as the regular nurse.

The Community Nurse was loaned to the School Committee for the vaccination Clinic and to Dr. Burt for his private clinic for diptheria prevention.

The abolition of piggeries has been discussed at length from time to time but no satisfactory method of procedure has been found.

With the addition of another slaughterhouse, there are now no substitute inspectors and applications for this position will be received by the Board.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Committee of the Town of Westport:

Gentlemen:

In accordance with custom I submit the fifty-third in the series of annual reports of the school superintendents of this town.

The national need today is for post-war planning. This is fully as essential for public school systems as it is for industry, agriculture and commerce.

War needs and activities have shown us some of the short-comings of our schools of the past and in some instances, at least, have pointed the way toward more effective teaching in the future. It has been definitely proven that, where there is real interest and a realized need, boys who were "failures" in school can study and achieve. I am more than pleased with the war record of the service youth of Westport.

In planning our curriculums and teaching methods for the immediate years ahead, Westport must profit from the experiences of the past four years. The Rinehart System of Handwriting which was introduced in grades 1-8 last fall is a supervised method of *practical* instruction and is already paying dividends. The most pressing needs would seem to be for more instruction in elementary science, teaching and practice in health and health habits, and a further development in functional English, both spoken and written — this for all grades. We also need a real program of physical education. Once again, in the life span of many of us, war has shown us that too many of our youth lack well balanced body development. Healthy bodies make for healthy minds — both essential to a safe and sane citizenship.

This war has also brought home to our youth the desirability of an education at the high school and, in many instances, the college level.* All indications are that more boys and girls are going to remain in school and graduate from High School. The more to remain in high school the more there will be who cannot handle with profit the so-called college preparatory subjects *as taught* for those college bound.

From a reading of studies made in the field of secondary education, and from our war period experience with a few small and carefully selected classes, I am convinced that a small high school, like ours, should provide a curriculum covering four years, and including English, mathema-

* During the past four years several of our graduates have shown that they are capable to doing work of college grade in Liberal Arts Colleges and recognized Engineering Departments. Some of them already have credit for as much as two years of college work, and are capable of graduation when service conditions permit their renewed attendance at college.

tics, natural science, and political and social science in each of the four years. There should also be room for physical education, health teaching and a guidance program. All of these courses should be developed along simple practical lines that will interest average and slow pupils and thus be within the scope of their abilities.

Our programs in Agriculture, Household Arts, and Shop Work (for boys) should be retained, perhaps expanded. Typing instruction should be available to every high school pupil. Shorthand, Office Practice, foreign languages, advanced mathematics and science with a pre-college flavor should be limited to those with proven ability and their teaching should be accelerated so that they can be covered in one-half the time devoted to them in present day classes where many of the pupils cannot progress smoothly and rapidly and have little to show for their efforts, unless it be a grade of "X" or "C".

By contracting the specialized courses into half-year units even a small school can provide a differentiated program without increasing the numbers on the faculty.

Curriculum changes, on paper, and improved teaching methods, in theory, will be found to function only as the teaching force is kept capable, active, and real converts to the policies adopted by the School Committee. The shortage of teachers is more acute than ever. Thanks to the married ex-teachers in our community we have been able to carry on, but it is essential that we introduce "new blood" from year to year. This will be impossible unless we can keep our salary schedules reasonably close to those other school systems who will compete with us for "man power".

The trend toward fewer pupils in our school system has stopped and for the past two years a slight increase has been noted. This increase is showing in the high school in

spite of the present opportunities for employment. All indications are that within three to five years' time our high school building will be taxed beyond its effective capacity.

Our elementary buildings are sadly in need of repairs and modern sanitary and health producing features. The heating and plumbing at the Head School are obsolete and about worn out. The two room portable at Greenwood Park is a mere shell, likely to prove useless at an early date. Lighting at the Head, Factory, Portable, North Westport and Westport Point Buildings is far below the candles required for healthy vision. Too many of our pupils find it necessary to wear glasses. The toilets at both Booth's Corner and Brownell's Corner are anything but satisfactory.

The condition of our present buildings, the indications of a definite rise in school population, and the evidences of an increase in home building all point to the necessity of a school building program for the Town of Westport.

I recommend:

That the Head School Building be modernized at once (I see no chance to abandon this building for years to come). Without a new heating and plumbing system this building will not be inhabitable another year. The heaters were repaired this fall and the contractor hopes they will survive this heating system.

That a school survey, including the expert advice of an outside specialist, be made so that a long range plan for improvements and expansion can be adopted.

That Federal Funds, now available, be secured for planning at least one new school building to be erected at the earliest moment feasible.

That the Town vote at the March Meeting to purchase war bonds to be ultimately used for school house construction. Free cash is available for this purpose. To construct a new building of sufficient size to insure economical operation would cost more than the borrowing capacity of Westport permits. By setting aside free cash annually, it will be possible to put up a building when the time arrives without appreciably increasing the tax rate for any one year.

The future welfare of the children of Westport demands the wholehearted support of every true citizen of this town. This support entails co-operative planning for many of us and intelligent compromising and some financial sacrifice for each of us.

For our part, we the teachers of Westport, to quote from Miss Audrey Tripp's report— . . . "must have a renewal of inspired teaching, of firm but fair disciplining, and of tolerant understanding in order that we may intelligently guide our pupils who have innocently become the greatest sufferers during the educational turmoil of these past four years".
