Westport Board of Health COVID-19 Update September 24, 2020

Case Update:

Total number of <u>state</u> confirmed COVID-19 positive cases of Westport residents as of Sept. 23rd is **133**, **which is an increase of 5 cases since last week**. Westport remains in the green or low risk category. The rolling 14 day incidence rate is now 2.6/100,000. We have had 121 recoveries to date, and no new deaths or hospitalizations.

But as can be seen on the statewide interactive map, the number of high risk towns has climbed due to a spike in cases – which are often associated with large gatherings. So if we want Westport to stay green we have to keep at it and maintain social distancing, wear face coverings, and wash or sanitize hands frequently. The state map is updated based on the state's weekly community COVID report, which is published very Wednesday evening.

Statewide there have been **126,408 confirmed cases** and **9,135 confirmed deaths** as of September 23rd. Massachusetts is still reporting about 2000 new COVID-19 cases statewide each week. The state is also reporting 629 cases associated with higher education to date, with 130 added in the last week.

Testing Data:

5359 COVID tests have been performed on Westport residents up through September 23rd. There were **7 positive tests** out of 699 done in the last 14 days for a rate of **1.00%, holding steady.** The statewide 14-day average is down to 0.85% positive.

The state's **Stop the Spread** free testing initiative in certain communities has been <u>extended through October</u>. The sites in these communities are open to all. To find a site visit <u>www.mass.gov/stopthespread</u>.

Travel Order: The list of higher and lower risk states changes often so make sure to check the status before any travel. The current list of lower risk states is: WA, OR, CO, NM, NY, NJ, VT, NH, ME & CT. Rhode Island remains on the restricted list. Detailed travel order instructions and the travel risk map can be found here. In summary, all visitors entering Massachusetts, including returning residents, must:

- 1. Complete the online Massachusetts Travel Form prior to arrival, unless they are visiting from a lower-risk state.
- 2. Quarantine for 14 days or produce a negative COVID-19 test result that has been administered up to 72-hours prior to arrival in Massachusetts.

Revised gatherings order applies to both public and private property:

- Outdoor gatherings limited to 50 people
- Indoor gatherings limit is 25 people
- Masks required for any group of 10 people from different households.

Outdoor Dining: If you use a tent for outdoor dining, you may now enclose all four sides of the tent, but you must follow the indoor dining protocol. If you are going to use patio heaters fueled by propane/natural gas etc. Please contact the Fire Department before using.
