1812 Voted that the sum of twelve Hundred Dollars be raised, by way of Tax on the polls and estates of the Inhabitants of the Town for the support of the poor and schools and other expences of said Town the year ensuing, to be collected & paid into the Town treasury by the first day of April next, And the assessors are directed, to assess & sum in the way and manner directed by Law, and deliver a list or lists thereof to the collector as soon as may be. Voted that the sum of One Hundred and twenty Dollars of the afores^d twelve Hundred Dollars, be appropriated for the support of schools, to be proportioned to each school kept in the town, in proportion to the number of days schooling, the whole number of scholars shall receive in said school, the schools kept by mistresses to have one half the sum in proportion to the days schooling, as those schools kept by school masters & that in each school district, the masters and mistresses are required to return, the number of days chooling, in their schools kept within the year, to the selectmen on or before the first monday of april next, and those that do not make such returns by said time, are not entitled to any of said sum, neither are any of said returns to be excepted of, by the selectmen at any time after and the selectmen are directed to divide the sum accordingly.

1812 The committee on accounts made a report in writing that they had attended the business assigned them, and that they had allowed to the several persons named in the list presented by them, the several sums set against their respective names amounting to the sum of — Twelve Hundred & six dollars and nine cents \$1206.09^c It was therupon voted to except the report of the committee and the treasurer is directed to pay the several sums thus allowed by the committee, to the several persons therein named and charge the same to the Town.

The committee also report that, agreeable to their appointment, they made a settlement with the Town treasurer and found that he had reciev'd for the Town the year past the sum of — \$933.40 and has paid by his accoumts the sum of \$876.40 leaving a balance in favour of the Town — \$57.36 Which balance was by the said treasurer William White paid to Mr. B. Gifford the towns present treasurer which made an even balance between the said White and the town of Westport and we made a settlement with him accordingly.
