

H.R. A Landing Resurveyed May 10<sup>th</sup> 1788 (From Book B. Page 18)

For the subscribers resurveyed and laid out for the use of the town of Westport A certain landing place at the head of and on the west side of the East branch of Acouset River so called. It being a piece of land Left by the proprietors of the town of Dartmouth for the use of the Public and improved as such for more than sixty years past Begun at the East side of a wharf by the River and in the division line between this land and land belonging to David Devol where named Devol now lives from thence measured west 3 deg. N. in the line of S<sup>o</sup> Devol's land 18 rods to a stone set in the ground with small ones about it from thence N. 3 deg. E. about 49 rods to the N. E. corner of S<sup>o</sup> Devol's lot of land by the Country road from thence easterly in the line of S<sup>o</sup> road to the river This Landing Place, <sup>bound</sup> on the River S. W. on S<sup>o</sup> Devol's land & N. on the Country Road

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H.R. Westport May 9<sup>th</sup> 1793. Then laid out the town landing in the said town at the Head of <sup>Acouset</sup> River and on the west side of S<sup>o</sup> River Beginning at the S. W. corner bound of land Surveyed for Christopher & Enos Gifford thence E. 4 deg. S. 18 Rods to the River then Beginning at the S<sup>o</sup> bound thence N. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  deg. W. 49 rods & 13 ft. to a stone set up in the Ground the S. side of the Country Road over against Peckham's shop thence easterly along the side of S<sup>o</sup> Road 16 rods & 13 ft. to the River
