And whereas the said subscribers in pursuance of said authority on the Fifth day of August last past, went upon the landing, near the head of Westport river, to determine the extent and boundaries of said landing.

Now be it known, that we the subscribers, being appointed for said purpose did on the said last mentioned day, ascertain and establish the following as the extent and boundaries of the public landing at the head of Westport River; viz;

Begin at a rock marked A. near the Bridge which crosses the head of Westport River, the same being a permanent and well known monument, thence South twenty one and one fourth degrees West nine rods fourteen and one half feet to the South West corner of Winslows Barn, thence South ten degrees West twenty five Rods - thence North eighty six degrees West as the Wall now stands to the River.

All of which is respectfully submitted, together with the consent of Thomas Winslow, in writing, agreeing to
