Article 1^o) Who constitute the Board

page 19 of the
Records) "The officers (of the association) shall be
a President, Secretary, Treasurer and Trustees.
ees, who shall be chosen annually, and hold
their offices, until others are chosen.

The Secretary shall be suzerain to the faithful
discharge of his duties.

They shall constitute a Board of Govern-
ment, and said Board of Government shall
have the general management, superinten-
Sale of lots, care of the property, sale of the lots in
the Cemetery, and the prudential ^{concerning} of the Cu-
and gination, and shall make a report of their
care doings to the association at their annual mee-
ting. The Secretary of the association shall
be secretary to the Board of Government."

Article 2^o

page 20- "The compensation of officers shall be
such, as the association may deem proper to
allow at its Annual Meeting"

2 from Article 3^e

page 20 - "All Rules & Regulations made by the Board of Government in the exercise of their duties, shall be submitted to the Association for their approval at their Annual Meeting; but shall take effect at the time of their adoption by the Board of Government."

Article 4th The Board fill all vacancies

Same page - "The Board of Government shall have power to fill any vacancies that may occur in the offices of this Association and the appointments thus made, shall hold until others are chosen."

From Conditions of Conveyance in the Deeds

Article 5th page 21 - That the proprietor of a lot shall have the right to enclose the same with a fence such as shall be approved by the Board of Government.

That if any tree or shrub situated in said lot, shall by means of their roots, branches or otherwise, be detrimental to the adjacent lots or avenues, or dangerous and inconvenient to passengers, it shall be the duty of said Board of Government, or a major

part of them for the time being, and they shall have the right to enter into the said lot and remove the said trees and shrubs, or such parts thereof, as are detrimental dangerous or inconvenient.

That if any monument or effigy, or any structure whatever, or any inscriptions, be placed in or upon said land, which shall be determined by a major part of the said

Monuments Board of Government for the time being to be

& offensive or improper, the said Board of Government, or a major part of them, shall have the right, and it shall be their duty, to enter upon said land, and remove the said offensive or improper object or objects -

That the said Board of Government will reserve the right to mow the grass upon all no unfenced lots, and no tree or shrub standing cutting without the lot of any proprietor, shall be down trimmed, cut down or destroyed, without Trees) the consent of the Board of Government -

That in no case shall the proprietor sell or transfer said lot unless said transfer is approved by the Board of Government or Transfer a major part of them, and the Secretary of Lots) shall make an entry of such transfer and approval in the records of the association."

Article 6th Assessments

page 23. "The Board of Government shall have the power of levying an assessment on each sold lot as numbered on the plan of the Cemetery in the possession of the association not exceeding however one dollar annually for repairs, general improvement of the Cemetery in fences, trees, avenues, incidental expenses &c. But all lots belonging to the association unsold shall be exempt from such assessment, also the lot called the 'Potter's field'."

Article 7th Board of Government & Treasurer.

page 24. "All assessments & debts shall be collected by the Treasurer, and all payments from the Treasury, must be made by order of the President & the Treasurer shall give such bonds for the faithful performance of his duties as the Board of Government shall require, and shall report to them annually the condition of the Treasury; and the said Board of Government or a committee of them, shall whenever they deem proper have access to his books and accounts, and vouchers; and shall audit and examine the same as often ^{as once} in the year and report to the Annual meeting".

Board of Government to make Dividends.

From Article 9th

page 25. "And the Board of Government shall annually from the lots sold, and paid for in each year, make such a dividend as the condition of the Treasury will warrant, and direct the ~~Treasurer to pay~~ the same ~~paid~~ over to each creditor stock holder in proportion to the balance which shall be due each on the Treasury's books, until such indebtedness shall have been paid".

per month additional for each month it so
remains - Provided however that if the
corpse is deposited by an owner of a lot in
the Cemetery, and intended for burial in
the same - Then no charge shall be made for
such deposit. The money received for the
above shall go towards paying incidental
expenses.
