Westport Mass. March 9th, 1878.

At a Regular appointed Meeting of the First Christian Church of Westport Mass., held in their house of worship this 9th day of March, at 2 o'clock P.M. the following Business was transacted as marking a New Era, in the history of the Church. Bro Pierce being invited to take the charge of the meeting, the following business was in order.

1st. Bro John A Smith, was chosen Clerk, Pro tem.
2nd. Bro Wm Gabor, who had been appointed to take the Charge of the meetings of the church in the absence of all the officers, (they having long since passed away, except the Clerk and he unable to attend,) expressed himself as having about finished his work; and desired that some one else should be appointed in his stead, and that he felt an interest as to who that person should be, and suggested that Bro Curtis J Pierce be that person, which was accepted and Bro Pierce was unanimously chosen to take the charge of all the meetings of the Church.

Bro Pierce said that he would accept the position, provided the Church would have a Covenant, and some proper Rules by which to transact the business; (there being but any) and presented a paper to that effect, (it being a copy of the Covenant & By-Laws, of the Christian Church

at Somers Mass,) suggesting that a committee be appointed to alter them to suit our wants. The Church showed its willingness to do any thing that appeared to be right, by immediately appointing a Committee of Five consisting of Bro Matthias Gammons, Sister Susan E Gammons, Bro James R Scutton, John A Smith, and Curtis J Pierce, who retired to another part of the house, and made such alteration (in said paper) as seemed necessary for the present occasion.

The Committee then presented its paper to the church, which was accepted, and unanimously adopted. And so it cometh to pass, that after an Existence of Fifty Nine Years, this church has for the first time put forth a written Covenant, showing to some extent, what love has done in the past, and what it can do in the future; that while it is good, and profitable, to covenant in writing, it is better, far better, to covenant in Love which cannot be written.

3d. In accordance with the By-Laws just adopted, the Election of Officers came next in order.

4th. Bro John A Smith was chosen Clerk for the ensuing year.

5th. Sister Susan E Gammons was chosen Treasurer.

6th. Not being able to secure bursier further, the Election of Officers were postponed to some future meeting.

Voted that we now adjourn to Apr 13. that being the time, of our next monthly meeting.

Westport Maſs. May 11th 1878.

Church-meeting day. After the Regular Covenant meeting, the Business meeting was called to order, by Bro C. P. Pierce.

1st. Proceeded to Elect the remaining Officers. The choice of Deacon, or Deacons being next in order. By a carefull perusal of the Old Church Book by Bro Pierce, it was found that on the 8th. day of October 1858, Brother Preserviel Tripp, was chosen to be Deacon of this church, and by conversation with him, Bro Pierce was informed that he was chosen without his consent, and that he had served in that capacity but a few times. Besides this he had also been absent from the community several years; but hoping that he might choose to serve in that capacity, he was recognized as filling the office, to which he was for the ensuing year chosen. Bro Tripp was also chosen Clerk, or Assistant, Apr 8. 1876. without his knowledge; which was considered valid, (to which he also assents).

2nd. Bro James R Larwin was nominated to fill the office of Second Deacon, but positively declined.

3d. The following Church Committee was chosen for the ensuing year Bro James R Larwin, Preserviel Tripp, C. P. Pier and Sisters Sarah & Thompson, and Sarah & Coggeshall.

Voted that we now adjourn to One month from to day

Westport Maſs July 13. 1878.

Not according to appointment in our regular Church Meeting Bro Stephen M Inglese being present, was invited to conduct the Meeting. Rev Gould Anthony, and Wife, were also present. after an interesting Social meeting, proceeded to Business.

1st. Bro Pierce presented the following Preamble and Resolution
(See other end of this book)

after reading the Preamble & Resolutions, in order to bring it before the meeting, Bro Pierce moved "That we rescind and repeal the former action of this Church in adopting its Covenant & By-laws March 9. 1878, which was accepted, and Unanimously adopted.

2nd. The following Resolution was then Presented and, Unanimously adopted. (See Resolved &c. Preamble & Resolution, Constitution Covenant and By-Laws at the other end of this book.)

3d. The following Resolutions were Presented and Adopted.
Resolved that the Clerk be authorized to procure a Book, to Record the doings of this Church; and have Two Hundred or, more copies of the Covenant & By-Laws printed. And that he Notify each Member of the action of the Church of late, by sending to each Member a Copy of the Covenant and, By-Law.

4th. that he present our wants to the next Meeting of the Society, asking for money to defray the expences of the same.

5th. Resolved that we will not hold Sabbath & School Concerts upon Sabbath Evening,

5th. A Resolution of Thanks.

Resolved that we tender a vote of Thanks, to Bro Robert Sarton for his efficient labors as Clerk of this church for the past 37 years, and authorize the Clerk to procure a copy of a book, Titled "Life at Three-score and Ten," by Albert Barnes, and cause the following to be written upon the fly-leaf of the same.

"A token of respect, and Resolution of thanks, is this book presented to Bro. Robert Sarton, by the First Christian Church of Westport Mass; appreciative of his services as Clerk of that body many years, and now unable to serve in that capacity, we ardently pray that your declining years may be cheered by Christian sympathy, and Christ's smile. The Church"

Adjourned to one month from to day

Westport Mass Jan 11th. P. M. 1878.

Met according to appointment; but three members present, and we adjourned to our next Church meeting Saturday Feb 8. 1878.

Westport Mass Feb 8. 1878.

Met according to adjournment. Meeting called to order by Bro. Pearce. 1st. Minutes of last meeting read and approved. 2nd. Heard report of the Officers of last year which was accepted. 3rd. Proceeded to the Election of Officers for the ensuing year.

Bro John A Smith was chosen Clerk; and Susan E Gammon was chosen Treasurer, the office of Deacon remaining vacant. Bro Wm Francis (who is a member at Hixville) came under the watch and care of this church. Bro James Sarton, Wm. Francis, Sisters Sarah & Thompson and Sarah & Coggeshall were chosen a Church Committee.

Adjourned to our next monthly meeting

Westport Mass, March 8th, 1878.

Met according to adjournment, after the usual social meeting, was called to order by Bro Pearce. 1st. Minutes of last meeting read and approved. 2nd. Bro Wm Francis was unanimously chosen to be Deacon, in the place of Bro Preserviel Griff. (Bro C. Pearce was chosen pastor by the society placed in their records)

Westport Mass April 12th 1878.

Met according to appointment; after social meeting, proceeded to have 1. Minutes of last meeting read and approved. 2nd, Accepted the report of Bro Pearce, upon the name of Isaac C Booth, and at his request his name was Excluded from the List of membership. 3d. Bro Pearce was unanimously requested, to send letter of Exhortation and Inquiry to Margaret Andrews, Mrs Mary E Andrews, Mr Maria de Andurian Ellis, Miss Adelia Ann Cram, Mr Edward M. Read and Wif. Alice Jane Read; requesting them to be present at our next Monthly meeting to be held May 10. 1878 at 3 Colch P. M. and then and there report themselves.

Westport Mass May 10 1875.

But few present and no business done. John Smith Clerk.

Westport Mass June 17. 1875.

Met according to appointment; after social meeting proceeded to business.
1st minute of last meeting approved. 2nd Bro Pierce reported as having sent a letter to each of the persons requested (see April 12) stating that the Committee would ^{call} on them. 3d The committee reported that they had visited as they were requested, and failed to bring about the desired result. They expressed a desire for their names to be dropped, ^{We recommend} as follows. Miss Margaret Andrews and Mrs Mary E Andrews have joined the Sabbath-day Saints; Mrs Maria S. Eliot & Miss Melicie Ann Clegg for improper conduct be dismissed.

A tenderness prevailed at the reading of the names of Mr & Sister Read, failing that something ought to be done and yet unwilling to drop a name until obliged to the following resolution was adopted. Resolved that Bro Edward M. & the same Read be granted another year grace, that they be visited faithfully if they return with in said year. Well! otherwise, their names will be erased; with out further action. 4th The Committee presented the name of Mrs Mary S. Hodge as unworthy of fellowship and it was dropped accordingly. 5th Bro Pierce presented the Constitution &c. to Rev J. H. Cox of New Bedford, who recommended some changes therein, which were adopted unanimously.

Pierce. 1st Minutes of last meeting read and approved. 2nd Heard report of the Officers of last year which was accepted. 3rd Proceeded to the Election of Officers for the ensuing year. Bro. John A. Smith was chosen Clerk; and Susan C. Gammons was chosen Treasurer. Bro. Wm. Francis was chosen Deacon. Sisters Robt A. Lawton, Sarah A. Thompson, & Sarah A. Coggeshall were chosen a Church Committee. Adjourned to our next monthly meeting. John A. Smith. Clerk.

Westport Mass May 30. 1880.

At a special meeting of the Church called by the Pastor at the close of the morning services the following business was transacted by a request from Bro Albert D. Blanchard for a letter to join the Christian Church at Rice City Coventry. Res. I. Was granted. also another from Sister Mary Tripp to join the Advent Christian Church Hammond St. Providence Res. I. was granted. Closed with the Benediction. Curtis P. Pierce Clerk Protem. John A. Smith Clerk.

Westport Mass Sunday Nov 21st 1880.

At a special meeting of the Church at the close of the morning services, Sister Sarah A. Thompson who was Treasurer of the Sabbath School connected with the Church, reported the sum of \$12.27 in the Treasury, and as she was going to move

away, it was voted that the Treasurer of the Church should hold the money until it was needed for another Sabbath School. Curtis I. Pierce Clerk Pro Tem. John A. Smith Clerk.

Westport Mass. Mar. 12th 1881.

Met in our regular Church meeting called to order by the Pastor. Prayer offered by the Pastor. Minutes of the meetings of the last year was read and approved. Treasurer reported \$12.27 belonging to the Sabbath School in the Treasury. John A. Smith was chosen Clerk. James R. Lawton was chosen Treasurer. Sarah A. Coggeshall. Roby A. Lawton & Susan E. Gammons was chosen Church Committee. Adjourned. C. I. Pierce Clerk Pro Tem. John A. Smith Clerk

Westport Mass Aug 21st 1881.

At the close of the morning service of the Church Brother James R. Lawton and John A. Smith were chosen Delegates to represent the Church in the R. I. & Mass Christian Conference to be held at North Westport Sept. 13 & 14, 1881. C. I. Pierce Clerk Pro Tem. John A. Smith Clerk.

Westport Mass Aug 28th 1881.

At the close of the morning service the request of Sister Mary E. Earl was presented by the Pastor and it was voted to give her a letter to join the church at Brownells Corner. C. I. Pierce Clerk Pro Tem. John A. Smith Clerk.

Westport Jan 14, 1882

Met in our annual meeting Minutes of our last meeting read and approved. Voted that the report of the treasury be accepted. Voted that the report of the church committee be accepted. Voted that John A. Smith be Clerk the ensuing year. Voted that James R. Lawton act as deacon the ensuing year. Voted that sister Roby A. Lawton Susan E. Gammons Sarah A. Coggeshall be a church committee. Voted that we now adjourn. John A. Smith Clerk

and a letter of commendation and dismission was tendered her, no other business on hand a few plain pungent remarks were made by C. J. Pierce reviewing the past, and pointing out some circumstances which have been the main cause of our present low state giving warning that if need be discipline will be resorted to. Voted to adjourn

Jan 12th 1884 the annual meeting of the church was held in their house of worship Jan 12th at 3 pm 1884, the meeting was called to order by C. J. Pierce prayer by James R Lawton after which C. J. Pierce was chosen chairman, 1st treasurer James R. Lawton reported that he had put the Sabbath school money in the old Savings bank Fall River, no report from the church committee, the choice of officers being next in order, John A. Smith was chosen clerk, James R Lawton treasurer, and Mrs Sarah A. Coggeshall, Mrs Susan E. Gammons, and Reoby A. Lawton church committee, Voted unanimously that there be no services held by this church, unless so authorized by the committee, or by vote of the church at some regular or special meeting. Voted to adjourn. C. J. Pierce clerk present

Whereas it is essential in all civilized Societies, that some
suitable place be provided for Public Worship, and as there is none
near the village at the head of the East Branch of Seacoast River
in Westport, the Subscribers willing to contribute for that purpose
hereby agree to pay what we here subscribe in order to Build a
house for public Worship, Said house to be free for all Denom-
ination of Christians to assemble in, and worship in their own
way when unoccupied by the Church & Society Established at
that place by the name of the Christian Church and Society.

Preamble & Resolution.

Constitution,

Preamble & Resolution:

Whereas, in the estimation of this Body, the time has fully come when we have reason to believe that Zion is to be favored again with the refreshing dews of heaven, and strengthened as in the days of her youth, and as we (by reasons which we could not well help) have allowed duties, and business to pass by unheeded, have accordingly lost much harmony, and many precious spiritual seasons; And Whereas, our Covenant, which is good, yet in some respects fails to convey the real position which this Body occupies, thereby causing misunderstandings within, and leaving us open to imposition from without; and as our By-Laws, are somewhat defective, leaving out whole Articles, thus, making us powerless to perform duties and business as they had ought to be done, and leaving us in doubt as to what course to pursue, therefore.

Resolved, that we accept, and adopt the following Constitution, Covenant and By-Laws, as presented to, and amended by the Church this day agreeable to the Notice thereof, as given at our last regular meeting, and repeated at several subsequent services of the Church.

Constitution.

This Association of Believers, shall be denominated the First Christian Church of Westport Mass., and the members of the church as individuals shall be called Christians. See Acts 11:26 & 1 Peter 4:16.

Covenant.

We, the members of the First Christian Church of Westport, believing that we have passed from death unto life, hereby Covenant and agree, that we will accept the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testament as a Revelation from God, and as our only rule of faith and practice. We agree to walk together in maintaining the ordinance of the gospel and in using our best endeavors to glorify God in promoting the salvation of men, and building each other up in all the graces of the Christian character and life; and to these ends we adopt the following By-Laws to guide us in transacting the business of the Church.

By-Laws.

Article 1st. Meetings.

Sec 1. The meetings of the Church for religious worship, and for the transaction of business shall be held on the Second Saturday of each month.

Sec 2. The monthly meeting in January, shall be the annual meeting for the electing of officers and hearing reports from the Clerk, Treasurer, and Committee.

Sec 3. Special meetings shall be called by the Pastor or Deacons at the request of two or more members, when the Pastor or Deacons shall have been informed as to the business there of.

Article 11th. Officers.

Sec 1. The Pastor shall be Chairman of all meetings of the Church at which he may be present and in his absence, the Clerk shall call to order, and a Chairman be elected, in the usual manner.

Sec 2. The other officers of the Church, shall be a Clerk, Treasurer, Two Deacons, and a Church Committee of Five: of which committee the Pastor and Deacons shall be members.

Sec 3. All persons elected to office, shall continue to perform the duties thereof, until their successors shall have been duly appointed.

Article III. Duties of Officers.

Sec 1. The Clerk shall record to cleings of the Church, and keep a list of its members in a Book provided for this purpose; said book shall be the property of the Church, and shall correspond with all absent members, in his absence the Chairman may provide a deputant.

Sec 2. The Treasurer shall receive and hold, all funds belonging to the Church, and pay the same at the order of the Church or Deacons.

Sec 3. The Deacons shall make arrangements for the communion service, and wait upon the same; shall make preparations for Baptism, and assist the pastor; shall have charge of all sober, and in the absence of the pastor, shall have charge of all religious services.

Sec 4. The Church Committee shall have charge of the spiritual interest of the Church; They shall visit all members who shall neglect the monthly meetings, and all other members who from sickness, or other affliction, may be in need of aid and sympathy.

Article IV. Membership.

Sec 1 Candidates may be received by vote of Church, and the righthand of fellowship given, at any Monthly Meeting, or at any service of the Church during the Sabbath, by the Pastor, acting Pastor, or in their absence, by some person appointed for that purpose by the Church.

Sec 2. Any Member in good standing in the Church, who may prefer to be connected with any other Church of the Lord's poor, and who shall make such request, shall receive a Letter of Commendation and Dismission, signed by the Pastor and Clerk.

Sec 3. Any member guilty of conduct not becoming a Christian, shall be subject to discipline, according to the rule laid down by Christ and his apostle. For example in Mat 18:15-17

Sec 4. No proceedings shall be had against a member, except upon a complaint made to the Church in writing, stating explicitly the charge, and the accused shall be reasonably furnished by the Church with a copy of the complaint (when it can be properly done) and shall be allowed a full hearing; but no person shall be expelled except by a Two-Thirds vote of the Members present.

Article V. Sabbath School.

The members of this Church, are expected to do their utmost, to build up and support a Sabbath School; the object of which shall be to encourage and instruct the youth in the study of the Holy Scriptures.

Article VI. Amendments.

Sec 1. Amendments may be made to these By-Laws, by a vote of Two-Thirds of the members present, but no motion to amend shall be acted upon at the same meeting at which it is proposed.

Sec 2. All motions to amend shall be presented in writing.

Resolution Adopted July 18 1878

Resolved that we, the members of this Church are convinced, that the holding of Fair, Festivals, Bakes, and other Entertainments for the purpose of supporting the worship of God, is detrimental to the well-being of the Church; to true piety, and are stones of stumbling in the way of sinners; and that we will not countenance them among us. Proverb 1. 1.

Three Hundred and Twelve persons have joined this Church since its Organization by Old-Daniel Dix, in 1819. Present Number, — March 8. 1878, is One Hundred and Four.
