Greeting:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are
hereby directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of
Westport, qualified to vote in elections and town affairs, to assemble
at the Town Hall, in said town, on Monday, the eleventh day of
March next, it being the second Monday of said Month, at ten o'clock
in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles
viz:

- Art. 1st. To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.
- 2d. To see if the Town will revoke its acceptance of the provisions
of chapter 374 of the acts of the year 1895, relating to the office of
single highway surveyor.
- 3d. To see if the Town will vote to elect a Board of Road Commissioners,
consisting of three persons, one for the term of one year, one for the
term of two years, and one for the term of three years, and if the
Town so votes, then to determine when said Board shall be elected.
- 4th. To choose the following officers for three years, viz: one Selectman,
one Assessor, one Overseer of the Poor, one member of the School
Committee, one Fish Commissioner, one member of the Board of Health,
and two Trustees of the Public Library. Also one Trustee of the Public
Library for one year to fill a vacancy. Also the following officers
for the year ensuing, viz: Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Collector of
Taxes, Superintendent of Beech Grove Cemetery, one or more Constables,
one or more Auditors, three Fence Viewers, four Landings Commis-
sioners, a Single Highway Surveyor, a Draw Tender for Westport Point
bridge, a Tree Warden and all other necessary Town Officers and
Committees.
- 5th. To hear the reports of the Town Officers and Committees, and
act thereon.
- 6th. To determine to what department or departments the money last
received from the County Treasurer for Dog Fund shall be appro-
priated.

- 7th. To see if the Town will vote to fix the rate of taxation for the year ensuing before the appropriations are made for the year.
- 8th. To make appropriations for the following purposes, viz: Salary of the Superintendent of Schools, Services of Town Officers and Committees, Support of Schools, Schoolhouses and Lots, School Furnishings, Highways and Bridges, Paupers, Public Library, Incidentally, Military Aid, State Aid, Soldiers' Relief, Town debt and Interest.
- 9th. To see if the Town will vote to macadamize a piece of road at Westport Point, beginning where it left off last year and continuing northerly, and make the necessary appropriation therefor.
- 10th. To see if the Town will vote to macadamize a portion of the highway commencing at the Rhode Island line near Adamsville and extending southerly towards Westport Harbor on the New Road so called, and make the necessary appropriation therefor.
- 11th. To see if the Town will vote to macadam the road from the foot of the lane, so called, northerly to Akins corner, and make an appropriation for the same.
- 12th. To see if the Town will vote to continue the macadamizing of the road southerly from Kirby's corner, beginning at the place where the present macadam leaves off, and make an appropriation therefor.
- 13th. To see if the Town will vote to macadamize the highway beginning where they left off near Barni Potter's and continuing southerly to Booth's corner, so called, and make an appropriation therefor, and determine the manner of raising said appropriation.
- 14th. To see if the Town will vote to macadam the road beginning at the State Highway and Benlah corner, thence southerly to the corner of the Mouse mill road, and to determine the manner of raising said appropriation, and to make an appropriation therefor.
- 15th. To see if the Town will accept the act of the legislature, Chapter 548, Section 360, of the year 1898, authorizing the town to use the Australian ballot box in the election of town officers.
- 16th. To determine the location of the High School for the ensuing year.
- 17th. To see if the Town will appropriate a sum of money for Memorial Day, and choose a committee to receive and expend the same.
- 18th. To see if the Town will vote to accept the two drinking fountains under the provisions of an offer from the Westport Grange No. 181 P. of H.
- 19th. To see if the Town will authorize the Auditors to transfer sums of money from unappropriated money to other departments wherein there may be a deficit.
- 20th. To see if the Town will authorize the School Committee, Overseers of the Poor, Single Highway Surveyor, or Road Commissioners, and Board of Health to order bills against the Town for and on account of their respective departments.
- 21st. To see if the inhabitants will authorize the Town Treasurer to hire such sums of money in anticipation of taxes as will be necessary to meet the current expenses of the year.
- 22d. To determine the salaries or commission of the Town Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Sealer of Weights and Measures, Tree Warden, Draw Tender and Superintendent of Beech Grove Cemetery.
- 23d. To see if the Town will appropriate a sum of money to be expended by the Tree Warden in planting shade trees in the public ways or upon adjoining land for the purpose of shading or ornamenting the same.
- 24th. To see if the Town will appropriate a sum of money to be expended under the direction of the Tree Warden in exterminating insect pests within the limits of the public ways and places and in the removal from said ways of trees and other plants upon which such pests breed.
- 25th. To determine the wages for ordinary repairs on Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
- 26th. To determine the wages for labor in connection with the stone crusher plant, and macadamizing the highways for the ensuing year.
- 27th. To see if the Town will accept the list of names of jurors as

prepared by the Selectmen.

- 28th. To see if the Town will vote to appoint a committee to investigate the claim of Clarinda W. Macomber against the Town for damage and give said Committee power to act in the matter.
- 29th. To see if the Town will appropriate a sufficient sum of money to pay a proper charge of an insurance company for acting as surety on the official bond given to the Town by its Treasurer for the faithful discharge of his duties.
- 30th. To determine the manner of raising the appropriations to defray the Town charges for the ensuing year.

- 31st. To see if the Town will vote to charge interest on all taxes remaining unpaid after a certain date and determine the rate per cent. of said interest.

The Town Clerk, Selectman, Town Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Overseer of the Poor, Assessor, member of the School Committee, Single Highway Surveyor, member of Board of Health, Trustees of the Public Library, Fish Commissioners, Constables, Fence Viewers, Landing Commissioners, Auditors, Tree Warden, Draw Tender, and Superintendent of Beech Grove Cemetery, to be voted for on one ballot.

Also at the same time and place, upon a separate ballot, "Yes" or "No", upon the following question, "Shall license be granted for the sale of intoxicating liquors in this Town."

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up four or more attested copies thereof in as many public places within said Town, seven days at least before the time of holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not, and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon, to the Town Clerk at the time and place of meeting aforesaid.

Art. 5th To determine to what department or departments the money last received from the County Treasurer for Dog Fund shall be appropriated.

Art. 6th To make appropriations for the following purposes, viz:

Salary of the Superintendent of Schools, Services of Town Officers and Committees, Support of Schools, School-houses and Lots, School Supplies, Highways and Bridges, Paupers, Public Library, Incidentals, Military Aid, State Aid, Soldiers' Relief, Town debt and Interest.

Art. 7th To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money to make up the deficiency between accrued interest and interest promised by the town on deposits for perpetual care of Burial Lots.

Art. 8th To see if the Town will vote to macadamize a portion of the highway beginning at the Rhode Island Line, near Adamsville, and extending southerly to Westport Harbor on the lower road, so called, and appropriate the necessary funds therefor.
