MASTER PLAN REVIEW/UPDATE COMMITTEE MINUTES

Co-Chairman Mark L. Schmid called the meeting to order at 4:01 p.m. with members, Co-Chair David Cole, Robert Daylor, Henry Lanier, Manuel Soares, Ann Boxler, and Town Planner Jim Hartnett were in attendance. Jim Whitin joined the meeting at 4:27 p.m.

Schmid read the virtual meeting notice into the record. This is the eighth meeting of the Master Plan Review/Update committee.

Call to order 4:00 p.m.

1. Minutes

June 14, 2021

Motion

Daylor moved to approve the minutes of June 14, 2021. Seconded by Cole. Upon a roll call vote being taken, members Cole, Daylor, Lanier, Schmid, and Soares voted age and the motion carried 5-0. Ms. Boxler abstained.

2. Chapter Reviews

a. Traffic

Daylor discussed if the goals are still relevant, what progress has been accomplished, and what goals should be set for the future.

Cole and Whitin recommended establishing a public works department to oversee a possible new water and sewer facilities.

Cole inquired whether the Town Planner could solicit feedback from Town Council on how to amend the charter for water and sewer.

Motion

Cole motioned to submit a request to the town attorney through the Board of Selectmen on the proper procedures to implement a Public Works Department and how to institute water and sewer districts. Seconded by Daylor.

Cole rephrased his motion to formulate wording of a request for exploring what's needed to establish a Department of Public Works and other related services going forward in the town.

Cole withdrew his motion.

Ms. Boxler proposed summarizing the Master Plan Committee's goals and presenting them to the Selectmen.

Daylor noted some changes made to Chapter 10, Town Meeting authorized \$250,000 for sewer design along the Route 6 corridor.
