1. Route 6 Phase 1A Sewer Design Grant Award

The Baker-Polito Administration has informed the Town that the grant in the amount of \$380,000 from the Rural and Small Town grant program has been approved. The grant application was initiated by the Planning Board and filed by the Select Board earlier in the year. This grant does not require any matching funds from the Town and will be used to complete Phase I of the Route 6 Sewer design. This is the section between the Westport/Fall River Town line and Route 88. (Award Letter in the packet)

2. Budget Update

Most of the departments have submitted their budgets requests for FY23, the remaining budgets should be in this week. Will be scheduling individual meetings with the departments starting on Monday, November 29, 2021. Capital Improvement Planning Committee met on Wednesday, November 17<sup>th</sup> and will meet again on December 1<sup>st</sup> to review department requests. Supplemental funding will be required for the FY22 budget to cover property insurance increases and coverage for the new school.

3. Westport Point Parking/Turnaround

There have been a number of meetings with Town departments, business owners and neighborhood representatives to discuss emergency access and parking at Westport Point. At this time the group was in general agreement that the turnaround should be clearly delineated, with striping and "No Parking" signs. This may require repaying the turnaround and the existing 6 parking spots at the end of Main Road. Funding for this work would need to be identified.

4. Deer Crashes

AAA published an Advisory on October 26, 2021, regarding deer crashes. According to the advisory deer crashes peak in autumn because it's deer mating season which means they're on the move at dusk and dawn. Last year at this time between October and December, Westport had 24 deer crashes, the highest number in the state. The advisory can be found at the following link:
