1. SRPEDD Annual Meeting

SRPEDD is holding their annual meeting at White's of Westport on May 25, 2022, a copy of the invitation is included in folder.

2. SouthCoast Rail Update

Work continues in East Taunton, Fall River, Lakeville and Berkley, a copy of the construction update dated April 26, 2022 is included in the folder.

3. Project Updates

Route 177 Roundabout

As requested by MassDOT, Pare Engineering is working through the alternatives analysis to confirm the roundabout as the most appropriate improvement for the intersection. Copy of the draft report should be completed this week, and will be added to the Board of Selectmen folder. The alternative analysis and required shared use path will require additional design work, and the Town is looking at different funding sources to cover the additional design work including, MassDOT, and Chapter 90 funding. State funding may also be available.

Hix Bridge Landing

The Landing Commission is working on a new design for the parking area and ramp at the Hix Bridge Landing. The \$50,000 contract for the state earmark has been approved by the state and the Seaport Economic Council has approved a grant in the amount of \$76,000 to cover the design costs. Upon receipt of the signed contract from the state, the Landing Commission will start the design process. Design should be completed in FY23, permitting could extend into FY24.

Green Communities

The town received a grant in the amount of \$200,000 from the Department of Energy Resources, this grant will be used to pay for lighting upgrades at the Beach Grove Cemetery Building, Harbormaster office, Highway Department, Macomber and Elementary Schools. Work is scheduled to be completed this fall. The Energy Committee and the Town's consultant are looking at the Town Hall heating system to see if it can be replaced under a Green Communities Grant, this would be a combined heating and air conditioning system.

4. Board of Health Grant

The Westport BOH has applied for \$300,000 DPH Public Health Excellence Grant, this would provide funding annually (expected to be available through 6/30/33). Westport would be the designated lead agency for the Southcoast Public Health Collaborative, which will include Freetown, Lakeville, Marion, Mattapoisett, and Rochester. The grant is designed to expand opportunities for cross-jurisdictional sharing to enable local public health to meet statutory requirements, respond to emergencies, and plan public health improvements. The grant will support additional staffing to be shared among all six communities. Funds may not be used to supplant existing BOH funding. Westport, as the lead agency, will also receive a 15% administrative fee.
