Item #1 – Town Treasurer Selection Process

Item # 2 – Westport TTHM Results

This summer the public water supply testing has shown elevated levels of TTHM. Safe Drinking Water Act limit is 80 ug/L. Recent readings for May were 89 and 86 in mid-August. The Westport annual running average is below 80 ug/L so there is no violation. However, there is some reason for concern. On October 9 I will be meeting with Linda Correia, our Certified Water Operator and Ryan Trahan from Environmental Partners Group to discuss the situation.

Item # 3 - Sampson Farm Solar Project

Board Chair Shufelt and I attended an event for Blue Wave Solar's Sampson Farm Solar Project at 222 Old Bedford Road.

Item # 4 - Vaping Product Ban

Attached is an advisory from KP Law explaining the state's Emergency Order banning the sale of vaping products.

Item # 5 – MS4 General Permit

Thanks to the efforts of Jim Hartnett the Town filed the Year 1 Annual Report. There will be additional tasks for Year 2. They will require some engineering consultant assistance. Funds were appropriated in the FY 20 budget for that purpose.

Item # 6 – Beech Grove Cemetery Road Paving

The contractor will be doing the Beech Grove Cemetery Paving over the next couple of weeks. This will be timely for the Veterans' Day events.

Item # 7 – High School Reuse

MassDevelopment has initiated the project to conduct a feasibility study for the High School Reuse. They will be undertaking an RFP process for selecting a consultant to assist with the study.
