Item #1 – <u>Rte 177 Supplemental Budget Earmark</u>

Senator Rodrigues was able to secure a \$150,000 earmark in the FY 20 State Supplemental Budget. This will be used to fund safety and upgrades to the Rte 177/Tickle Road Intersection. See attached letter.

Item # 2 – Town Hall Annex

Over the past couple of months there have been unanticipated problems with plumbing and heating system at the Annex. So far the cost to one vendor is \$11,035. This on top of the well problems earlier this fiscal year.

Item #3 - FY 21 Capital Improvement Planning

The CIPC has substantially completed the ranking for each of the FY 21 Capital Projects. The only one that still needs to be ranked is the \$600,000 fiber optic cable project.
