

The subscribers having been chosen a Committee to ascertain from the records if possible the Original laying out and limits of the several public or Town landings in Westport. To recover the same and set up suitable monuments at such places as they may deem necessary to designate the true boundaries thereof, and report their doings together with the names of the several trespassers and the nature of the trespasses upon said lands. To the annual Town Meeting having performed in part the duty assigned them now submit the following - - Report - -

That we have carefully examined the records and papers in the office of the Town Clerk - and such others as were deemed necessary from which we have ascertained -

1<sup>st</sup> as to the landing near Fox's Bridge - formerly so called - that in the year 1779 a landing was laid out near the Ferry, afterwards Fox's Bridge, by the selectmen of Bathonath. the return of which was included in the return of a road laid out at the same time, from Cadman's South West corner to the Ferry, and the only estate from Westport now known, is said Cadman's - now Holder Whites' South West corner opposite the meeting house, - in the year 1798 the selectmen recovered the Highway down to Fox's Bridge and also the landing - made no alterations - established no monuments - -

For the purpose of designating the boundaries of the landing - we commenced at said Holder Whites' corner opposite the meeting house and run Easterly and Southwesterly by the former return 270<sup>th</sup> rods which allowing for variation, reached a point in the Highway as above travelled, which we suppose to be the South West corner -
