An Interview with Judith Kalaora Founder and Artistic Director of History At Play™

Please tell me about your background -

As Founder and Artistic Director of *History At Play*, I research, write, produce and perform influential and often forgotten women. I earned a BFA in Acting from Syracuse University and completed the Globe Education Program at Shakespeare's Globe Theatre in London, where I honed my script analysis, production and performance skills.

What inspired you to portray Christa McAuliffe?

My sister asked if I would portray a woman from recent history, such as Christa McAuliffe, a teacher and astronaut from Concord, NH. It was an inspired idea, in part, because Christa grew up in Framingham, MA, as I did. Christa has become a phenomenon – people remember exactly what they were doing on January 28, 1986, the day she and six other crew members died when the Challenger Space Shuttle exploded. I realized people didn't know much about her life before boarding the Challenger, though her life is a history lesson in itself. When I engaged Christa's family and friends to learn about the first 36 years of her life, I dug deep to discover who she was and what led her to become an educational pioneer, who excelled in organizing experiential field trips to bring history to life. I became close to Christa's friends, as they revealed their memories, and her family has entrusted me to portray Christa authentically.

What will the audience learn?

My 80 minute portrayal is like opening a photo album of Christa's life, with video and sounds. People of every age find it engaging and powerful.



My Love of Libraries

I have just finished reading *The Library Book* by Susan Orleans which chronicles the 1986 fire that destroyed or dam-

aged over a million books at the City of Los Angeles Central Library. In telling the story of the fire and subsequent investigation, the author manages to, in her words, "tell people about a place I love that doesn't belong to me but feels like home." The part



of the book that moved me most was the description of her trips to the local library with her mother.

Mom has always loved libraries. As a girl of 14, she worked at her local branch of the Providence Public Library on Hope Street. She even earned her certificate in Library Sciences, hoping to transition from school administration to working in a school library. When I was young, Mom and I would take special trips to the Peace Dale Public Library in South Kingstown, RI near our summer home. This was a cavernous building built in 1891 with gables, dormers, nooks and even a balcony filled with rows and rows of books looking down over the main rooms. What a perfect place for a little girl to roam and discover new books.

To this day, I still enjoy reading and participating in the monthly book group discussions here at the Westport Library,



but what I really enjoy is discussing books with Mom. At 89 she still attends her library's book discussion group and we often share our favorites back and forth. We recently shared a cup of Pu'er tea after reading *The Tea Girl of Hummingbird Lane* by Lisa See. It is from Mom that I learned that some of the best book discussions are about books

you might not have liked.

The love of books I developed as a young girl continues to this day. In an effort to spread my love for reading and libraries, you'll find me and my therapy dog Rosie sitting in the History Room as young readers read aloud to Rosie. I'm hoping that their trips to the Library instill a love for a place that also "feels like home".

It's Pronounced RIZ-dee

Have you thought about a family outing or a visit on your own to the RISD Museum? It has more to offer than you think. The only comprehensive art museum in

Southeastern

New England, it was established in Providence in 1877, located beside the Rhode Island School of Design.



The current collection contains more than 100,000 works of art and design from all over the world dating from ancient times to today. Always on exhibit are paintings and decorative arts from ancient Egypt, Rome and Greece, Asia, Europe, and 18-19th century America, as well as works from modern and contemporary artists.

The museum also offers programs designed for families on select Saturdays including Tours for Tots

(ages 3 to 5) at 10:30 a.m., a 45 minute session of playful stories, creative art making and gallery adventures. For children ages 6 and up, there's a one hour session to explore art using close examination, discussion and hands on making. For adults, the museum offers workshops, discussions and presentations on various art topics. All these special programs are free with admission.

And that's not all. There's a wonderful gift shop with eye catching and interesting wares to explore. To round out your day, stop at the museum's Café Pearl for a light lunch or afternoon refreshment, open Tuesday – Sunday, 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

The RISD Museum itself is open Tuesday through Sunday, from 10 to 5 and till 9:00 p.m. on the third Thursday of each month. The children's programs are free with admission; however, you must register beforehand. The museum is handicapped/ wheelchair accessible. Check out their website at risdmuseum.org to see all that's on offer and don't forget to pick up your FREE pass at the Library before you go! Free because funds raised through FOWL membership dues and book sales make possible the purchase of these RISD Museum passes for Westport Free Library patrons.
